

Anthropology and Cultural History Education Internship

This internship focuses on anthropological, historical, and cultural education at the Schiele Museum. Interns will help to maintain the Catawba Indian Village and run regular programs that teach about the Catawba and other Eastern Woodlands region indigenous groups, maintain the 18th century historic cabin at The Farm, and may help to facilitate primitive skills events and workshops (depending on the timing of workshops and internship duration). This internship is designed for students or recent graduates who focused on a degree in anthropology, history, archaeology, or other related field, and are interested in the educational aspects of their field.

Other things to know about this internship:

- Interns will be working both indoors and outdoors, and in a variety of weather conditions
- Must be able to work independently and improvise when necessary to provide quality programming
- Interns may be asked to lift up to 50lbs and/or carry objects around the museum, nature trail, and some offsite locations
- Interns may be loading material in and out of vehicles (golf carts, vans, etc.)

Weekend, holiday, and occasional evening availability is required
